Umpires Call

The skip releases the bowl with a full blooded drive. The bowl misses the intended target and is heading for the ditch. The opposing third puts his foot out and stops it before it enters the ditch. The skip asks for the bowl back to have the delivery over again. The opposing team is not happy and calls the umpire. What will he do?

Law 28.1, para. 1 dot point 5 to 8 states;

If the bowl is displaced by an opponent and it has not disturbed the head after it is displaced, the skip of the team that played the bowl should choose weather to;

Have the bowl replayed. Place the bowl where the skip believes it would have come to rest or leave the bowl where it came to rest.

The umpire has no choice but to let the skip play the bowl again. While this would be seen as a some what unsporting action by that skip some players will do anything to win a game. Know you opponent.
