Interview with 'Prezzo' Billy Web

How long have you been playing bowls and what clubs were you previously involved with?

I have been bowling for about14 or15 years. I started bowling at a club, now known as East lakes Sports. We enjoyed a certain amount of success being runner up in grade 5 in only my second year of bowls. To receive a bit more experience I moved to the Coogee Club. During this stage in our lives, we had thoughts of moving out of Sydney. We had friends at Taren Point, so we eventually moved there. We had a great time but found the travelling time just too arduous. Our final move was to the Camden area where we are very happy.

How do you think the club is going member wise?
