Bob Pinkerton Player of the Year & Rookie of the Year Trophies

As most would know there are now two new trophies being awarded each year. These have

been kindly supported and donated by Shane and Mitchell Smith from Wollondilly Electrical Contracting & Sales. Just so you know what you have to do to be a chance to win these trophies the following outlines the details.

The aim of the Bob Pinkerton Trophy is to single out and reward the best performed bowler over the calendar year (From Presentation Night to Presentation Night). All point events that fall between these two nights that are fully completed will be counted.

Who Can Win – All registered bowlers in the club are eligible.

Winner – Bowler with most points accumulated over the specified time that satisfies the criteria.

Award – The winner will have their name on the perpetual Bob Pinkerton Trophy (which will stay at the club on show). They will also receive a smaller Bob Pinkerton Trophy to keep and a cash award.

Points System – All points are tallied from events listed below that are completed between presentation nights.



NB – Included are the events that everyone can enter. So no minor events are listed. Representative selection is not included. Quarter final points will only be awarded if the player has won a previous round. i.e. not if the quarter final is

the first round.

District Singles – Winner 40, Runner Up 20, Semi Final Loser 10, Quarter Final 5

Club Major Singles, District Pairs, District Triples, District Fours = Winner 30, Runner Up 20, Semi Final Losers 7.5, Quarter Final 3.5

Club Major Pairs, Triples, Fours = Winner 25, Runner Up 15, Semi Final Losers 5, Quarter Final 2.5

Consistency Singles, Handicap Pairs, Major / Minor Pairs, Graded Triples, Mixed Pairs = Winner 15, Runner Up 10, Semi Final Loser 2.5, Quarter Finals 1

The aim of the Rookie Award is to single out and reward the most improved bowler over the calendar year (from Presentation Night to Presentation Night). All point events that fall between these two nights that are fully completed will be counted.

Who Can Win – All bowlers who have played less than 5 years of bowls up to the date of the presentation of the award.

Winner – Bowler with most points that satisfy criteria.

Award – Winner will receive their name on the perpetual trophy (which will stay at the club on show), they will also receive a trophy to keep and a cash award.

NB –Once a player has won the award they cannot win it again.

District Singles – Winner 40, Runner Up 20, Semi Final Loser 10, Quarter Final 5

Club Major Singles, District Pairs, Triples, Fours = Winner 30, Runner Up 20, Semi Final Losers 7.5, Ouarter Final 3.5

Rookie District Tournament = Win Tournament – 30, Runner Up – 20, Semi Final Losers 7.5, Quarter Final 3.5

Senior District Singles, Senior District Pairs, Reserve District Singles, Major Pairs, Triples, Fours = Winner 25, Runner Up 15, Semi Final Losers 5, Quarter Final 2.5

Minor Singles, Minor Pairs = Winner 20, Runner Up 12.5, Semi Final Loser 5, Quarter Final 2.5 Consistency Singles, Handicap Pairs, Major/Minor Pairs, Graded Triples, Mixed Pairs, Veteran Pairs, C Singles = Winner 15, Runner Up 10, Semi Final Loser 2.5, Quarter Finals 1.

Good luck to all and remember the only way to win these trophies is to get on the green.

Club Policies

Regardless of your role in sport, you have a number of rights and responsibilities.

You have the right to:

• not be unfairly discriminated against by decisions made by your club or association (e.g.,

decisions about membership, selection, access to facilities and equipment);

• complain about inappropriate and unlawful behaviours and for complaints to be taken seriously and acted upon promptly;

• a fair process and not to be victimised if you make a complaint or are complained about.


You have the responsibility to contribute to safe and harassment-free sport by:
