Coaching

With pennants starting this week we move into a period that can either be the most enjoyable form of bowls or one that can test your patience. This really comes down to the individual and how they approach the game.

Pennants only runs for approximately ten weeks so regardless of where you are picked to play enjoy the aspect of representing your club the best you can and enjoy meeting other bowlers from around the District. Have fun.

As there are a number of new bowlers this year playing their first game of pennants the following are some tips for each position in a fours game.

The Leads are required to draw their bowls as close to the jack as possible. The operative words here are "as close to the jack as possible". If the other lead puts one close don't go looking for a weighted conversion shot. Get second shot.

The Second must be a versatile player for defense, attack or recovery with the ability to;

Draw on either hand to the jack or to a position designated by the skip,

Be able to play on-shots to trail the jack to designated lengths,

Rest on or wrest out bowls from the head.

When the lead has failed, re-establish the leads obligation at the head,

The Third - It is essential the third works in complete harmony with the skip and members of the team. He must be in charge of the head when skips are bowling or in the skips absence.

If delegated, to measure for shot and decide with the opponent the number of shots and signal the result to skip and the manager. Update the score board when at that end.

Help to return bowls to a safe position behind the mat at the conclusion of each end.

Must know and be able to identify the teams and opponents bowls.

Answer the skips queries correctly and concisely. A good tip here for thirds is to 'be up and shut' up unless you are asked. There is nothing worse than the skip, having made up his mind on a shot, being given contrary advise from the third.

The skip carries the responsibilities and duties and therefore must be supported by the team.

He must be in charge of the team and delegate duties

As applicable instruct the team members which shot to play.

Make decisions with the opponent to comply with the laws the game and conditions of play, Ensure that the score card is returned to the appropriate authority with signature and time. Another general rule in pennants is that you are playing as part of a side. If your team is getting beaten badly try and consolidate and give away as few a number of shots as possible. Driving your way out of trouble can only end in tears for the whole side.

Good luck to all our sides competing this year and remember, have fun!

They continue drinking their beer roundly condemning the vicar and the rabbi when they see their own Catholic priest knock on the door.


