Ten Interesting Facts About Lawn Bowls



1. Lawn bowling has been played for centuries and is believed to have originated in ancient [Egypt](#).
2. It is a low-impact sport that can be played by people of all abilities, including those with disabilities or injuries.
3. The objective of the game is to roll a biased ball, known as a bowl, as close as possible to a smaller white ball, called the jack.

4. Lawn bowling is a social sport, often played in teams or pairs, where players take turns rolling the bowls.
5. The sport is played in more than 40 countries worldwide, with the [United Kingdom](#), Australia, and New Zealand being among the most popular.
6. Lawn bowling has been included in the Commonwealth Games since 1930.
7. The oldest surviving bowling green in the world is located in Southampton, England, and dates back to 1299.
8. There are several different types of lawn bowling games, including singles, pairs, triples, and fours.
9. The sport has its own unique set of rules and terminology, such as “touchers” and “dead ends”.
