#### **MEMBER PROFILE – ERIC MULLEY**

I was born in Matron Heise's Sunshine Nursing Home in Murray Street Camden (now the site of Centrelink) in 1938. My parents worked a dairy farm for Rofe Bros at Cawdor. I was the sixth child in a family of six boys and one girl. I attended Cawdor School and then Camden Central – no school bus those days – I rode my bike the five kilometers into Camden.

I started playing tennis at age seven on the school court at Cawdor. Later, when I was a student at Camden I was chosen as the only boy from the school to attend a week's coaching clinic at Wollongong conducted by Vic Edwards who later became the coach of Yvonne Goolagong. When I was 13, I won the C grade Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles. I graduated to A grade and played there for six years. Tennis was the biggest winter sport in the district. There was usually around 36 teams in six grades. However, by this time it was difficult to juggle tennis and cricket, as the seasons overlapped. My choice was to pursue my cricket career.

I first played organized cricket in 1951 for Mt Hunter. In 1956 I was enticed to join Cobbitty – the beginning of a 24-year First Grade career. My first experience of representative cricket came when I played for the Camden District as a 14-year-old in the under-18 team.

The following is an excerpt from a book published in 2019 which chronicled the history of organised cricket in the Camden District

Eric Mulley was arguably the best batsman to have played all his career in the CDCA. Eric was a right-hand opening or first-drop batsman. He was a free-scoring batsman noted for his straight driving.

He scored 10000 runs in First Grade at an average of over 45. In his first 16 years in First Grade, he scored 8400 runs at 55.3 – an incredible average of 525 runs per season. In the 13 seasons from 1956-69 he was among the top 5 run-getters in First Grade 11 times. He is only one of two players who have averaged over 100 on 2 occasions. He scored 25 centuries- the most by any player in any grade. He captained Cobbitty to 4 premierships in 6 years in the 70's.







In Gibson Cup cricket he is the only player to have scored over 2000 runs. His 5 centuries is also a record. (Gibson Cup was a one-day competition played between Penrith, Richmond/Windsor, Blue Mountains and Fairfield/Liverpool.)

My proudest sporting moment was walking out onto the Sydney Cricket Ground to open the batting for NSW Country v City in 1961 and again in 1962 and 1963. One notable member of the country team was Doug Walters.

I finished my cricket career in 1988 and thought it was time to have the weekend free. However, I found that I had too much unresolved competitive spirit. In the late 90's I took up lawn bowls. I soon won the minor singles and pairs and went onto to win various other events at our club.

I found that there was a lot more to bowls than I expected. I was excited to be playing sport competitively again. For the past 10 years my wife and I have been spending the winter in Bundaberg. It was there that I was mentored by Keith Whalley (a Premier League player and a Queensland over-65 champion).

I have always been very happy to beat higher graded players. It was a special thrill when Brian Cooke won the Veteran Pairs. It proves that age is no barrier to being a good sportsman. It is a pity that many talented players are disregarded because of their age.

I am happy that my sporting career did not end when I hung up my cricket bat. I have gained a lot of satisfaction and enjoyment from bowls and made a lot of new friends.

I have always lived in Camden. I worked variously in retail and the coal industry. My wife Barbara and I have three children, nine grandchildren and seven great-grand children. It's been an enjoyable innings – and still not out.

# Lawn Bowls Guide To Playing In Wet And Windy Conditions

Performing consistently on the lawn bowls green, hitting the perfect line and judging the perfect weight can be challenging on the best of days, never mind adding some windy conditions and/or some splashes of rain. Changes in environmental factors will affect every bowler in varying degrees, with some players able to adapt quickly and easily to damp or gusty conditions and others floundering. Check out the following guides and become a more adaptable bowler when the rain and wind strike during a game.

#### **PERFORMING IN THE RAIN**

It may be a simple and common sense thought to be properly prepared when heading down to the greens for a game of bowls, but we have all been part of a team or squad when one player has managed to forget shoes, playing shirt and yes.... Bowls. Checking your bowls bag that you have everything you might need is a necessity to properly prepare for a game. A quick check of the weather prior to leaving can give you that peace of mind that you are properly prepared, and you can then begin to focus on your pre-game routine. If in doubt about wet weather clothing – pack it and don't be thinking 'I wish I would have put that extra dry cloth into my bowls bag' later in the day. On an overcast day make sure to pack plenty of dry cloths, wet weather clothing and possibly a change of clothing so you are not playing in wet clothing the rest of the day.

When it comes to performing on damp or wet greens it tends to be more rewarding to be a more aggressive player, playing the "up shot" or "on shot" can produce more favourable results. With slower greens, bringing more narrow lines and attempting to play more "touch" bowls can really backfire due to bowls hitting damp/wet patches and pulling up short more quickly than normal.







Short bowls are always a killer, but even more so in wet conditions. **Playing** through the head is generally the better game plan so making sure bowls are past the head can play a vital role as the end develops, whilst also providing options for "up shots" and also provide defensive cover if holding shots.



#### **PLAYING ON WET / DAMP GREENS**

When bowling greens become wet or have early morning dew, they tend to be slower than normal. **This reduction in green speed will tend to favour bowlers who are playing with wider arc bowls**. This is inclined to be the case due to slower greens having narrower draw lines to the jack. Therefore, players with wider arc bowls will have a slight advantage allowing them to perform a greater array of shots and potentially having a greater ability to navigate around short bowls with a bowl that has a wider arc.

Regardless of the type of bowl you are playing with, one of the key factors to focus on while playing in wet conditions is weight control. Generally speaking, slower greens are more forgiving when trying to achieve the perfect line, whereas achieving the correct weight can be more of a challenge.

#### **USING THE WIND TO YOUR ADVANTAGE**

Wind can be a frustrating element to contend with on the bowling green and its effect on the bowls will vary substantially. The type of green you are playing on, wind direction and strength of the wind are factors that will determine the overall effect the wind will have on bowls travelling down the green.

In order to combat wind that is heavily affecting bowls across the green, if possible try to play the hand that wind is assisting the bowls and its bias with ie. Play the wider hand and play with the wind rather than against it if you have the option.









Another simple measure to negate heavy gusts is to pause on the mat when those gusts occur, there is no time limit on how long you have to deliver the bowl so pause for a moment to allow strong gusts to ease.

If the wind is blowing in the direction of the play ie. Up and down the green rather than across it, **strategically use the length of jack to try and even out the direction of the wind**. ie. If you are playing up the green with the wind behind you then play a longer jack and when you are playing against the wind with the wind in your face then play a shorter jack when able to. This strategy will help to keep your weight control consistent and perform a similar delivery tempo regardless if you are playing into the wind or not.

# Fieseler Fi 103R Reichenberg: Manned version of the V-1 Flying Bomb



#### **Igniting a Desperate Concept**

In the midst of World War II, under the heavy pressure of sustaining the war, German engineers embarked on a unique, bold venture. In 1944, they revealed the Fieseler Fi 103R Reichenberg. Unlike other aircraft, this was a manned version of the infamous V-1 flying bomb, a product of desperation and audacity. It was a radical answer to the war's challenges, a testament to the extreme conditions of those harrowing times.

The Leonidas Squadron, an initiative inspired by the Spartan king's do-or-die attitude, championed this daunting project. Their intention was clear – developing aircraft for suicide missions, an act of self-sacrifice to create significant damage to the enemy. It was a concept as shocking as it was innovative.











#### The Anatomy of a Human Bomb

The structure of the Reichenberg was similar to a conventional Fi 103 flying bomb. However, it had one striking difference – a cockpit. Where the guidance systems were typically housed, engineers now provided a seat for a pilot. The single-seater design underlined the mission's grim nature, setting it apart from all other aircraft of its time.

The cockpit was rudimentary and utilitarian, void of any comfort. This was not a plane meant for long flights, but one for a single, lethal delivery. The very design of the Reichenberg was a chilling reminder of the desperate strategies at play during World War II.



#### **Trailblazing the Skies**

In September 1944, the Reichenberg had its first real test flight at the Erprobungsstelle Rechlin. Launched from a Heinkel He 111, the maiden voyage ended in a crash. The incident occurred due to the accidental jettisoning of the canopy, causing the pilot to lose control. The very next day, a second test flight was attempted, but it also culminated in a crash. This string of failures raised questions about the Fi 103R's flight characteristics and its potential difficulty to land.

In a bid to avoid further accidents and uncover the source of these difficulties, additional test flights were undertaken by two experienced pilots, Heinz Kensche and Hanna Reitsch. Reitsch, despite being an exceptional pilot, also experienced several crashes, miraculously surviving each one unscathed.

On November 5, 1944, during the second test flight of the R-III, a wing detached from the aircraft due to extreme vibrations. Kensche barely managed to parachute to safety from the confined cockpit. These incidents led to the conclusion that the Fi 103R had a relatively high









stall speed, which pilots were unaware of. Consequently, attempts to land at speeds too slow for maintaining stable flight led to disastrous results.

#### The Unseen Legacy of the Reichenberg

The Reichenberg never saw the combat it was designed for. Political conflicts and strategy disagreements delayed its deployment. By the time the aircraft was ready, the advancing Allies had made its use irrelevant. The Reichenberg remained on the ground, its potential for destruction untapped.

However, its influence extends beyond its unfulfilled purpose. The idea of a human-guided missile sparked interest and laid the groundwork for future developments in aviation and warfare technology. Despite the grim nature of its mission, the Reichenberg project offered valuable insights into remote control and guidance systems, contributing to the evolution of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs).

In a way, the Reichenberg helped shape the future of warfare. Its contribution to drone technology made it an unexpected harbinger of modern warfare strategies. It serves as a stark reminder of the limitless potential of innovation, even born out of the most desperate of circumstances.

A large number of one- and two-seat "Reichenberg" missiles fell into the hands of the Americans. These were manned versions of the Fieseier Fi-103




