BOWLS LAWS: What actions may be taken to prevent a disturbance to the head by a bowl in course from an adjacent rink?

Answer Any player at the head can <u>choose</u> whether to lift the bowl at rest to allow the other bowl to pass and then replace it as long as this action would not influence the outcome of the head, or stop the bowl from the neighbouring rink. **Laws 37.6.1.1; 37.6.1.**2

If a **jack** at rest on the rink is in danger of being moved by a bowl from a neighbouring rink, any player at the head or the marker **must stop** the bowl. **Law 38.6**
