BOWLS LAW: On a windy day there is a narrow side and wide side to the rink of play. The skipper of Team A plays a bowl on the wide side which is passing down the adjoining rink when a barefoot bowler picks it up giving it to the third of Team B who is going to put it on the bank as a dead bowl saying that it was not on their rink when it was disturbed. Is he correct?
