BOWLS LAW: In a singles game Player A prefers short ends while Player B likes them long. Player A rolls the jack while the marker is walking down the rink, and it hits his foot. Player B wants to have the jack and roll it just as if it had gone out of bounds. Can he do that?

Answer: No. Under Law C.24.1 the marker is a neutral person and Under Law 38.3.1 where the jack is displaced by a neutral person it is re-rolled by player A.
