Characteristics that can influence results

The similarities between top bowlers exists primarily in their temperament ... more so than in their delivery technique.

Components of temperament can be expressed in terms of The 10 C's

COMMON SENSE – correction after poor deliveries.

CONTROL - your own personal actions and way of thinking.

CALMNESS - is the ability to neutralise stress in tight situations.

COMMITMENT – is the will to set goals for practice and competition.

CREATIVITY – is about seeing the ideal shot and to recognise tactical opportunities.

COLLABORATION - avoid destructive bickering and play in tune with your team mates.

CONFIDENCE – is the outcome of positive self-affirmation and improving personal bests.

CONCENTRATION – the ability to narrow one's focus to factors of immediate importance and to ignore distractions.

CONSISTENCY – is about avoiding variations to controlled techniques when faced with a difficult shot or during the excitement of competition.

MEMBER PROFILE – KERRY LOWE

Club stalwart Kerry Lowe was raised in the Sydney suburb of Belmore on a block large enough for his parents to have a Dry-Cleaning business at the rear of the property.

He represented Belmore North High School in Rugby League, Cricket, Tennis and was captain of the school Chess team but after few years he dropped all but Tennis, because of his love of playing in Country tournaments all around the country.

In these tournaments he was always joined by his coach Ross Sherriff, a well renowned tennis coach who had a single figure State Ranking behind the likes of Ken Rosewall, John Newcombe, Tony Roche, and Martin Mulligan to name a few, Ross's children Fred, Gail and Carol were also highly ranked players, as was another player Roger Waugh (father of Steve and Mark) of cricket fame, which made up the six of us regularly at these tournaments.

He partnered the likes of Phil Dent, Bill Loyd, and Syd Ball in local competitions. and he considered it a great thrill to be asked to hit up against National Champions Tony Roche and Martin Mulligan.

Kerry's most notable achievement in tennis was to play in the Champion of Champions Doubles tournament at Marrickville. To qualify you had to have previously won a tournament.

In this tournament he played John Alexander in a semi-final. After the game Alexander's father approached Kerry to be John's partner on his first overseas trip. Being three years older, Kerry instead suggested Phil Dent who was closer to John's age. The pair went on to win countless tournaments and represent Australia in the Davis Cup.


Looking for a partner for the mixed events, Kerry asked his friend Roger Waugh for advice. A young lady by the name of Helen Wright was recommended. Helen was the number one ranked junior at the time until replaced by a new girl from Barellan by the name of Evonne Goolagong. They became very good friends because of the number of finals they played against each other, with Evonne winning the singles and Helen taking the doubles each time. Kerry and Helen had a successful mixed pairs combination, going undefeated for three years at one stage. This feat was to be repeated in golf in later years. Kerry later married Helen in January 1973.

Kerry gave back to the sport of tennis that had been so good to him over the years, by becoming a Director of Southern Districts Tennis Club at Leumeah and also being on the Tennis Committee for a vast number of years.

After a successful career with the CBC Bank (since named NAB Bank) setting up the new Bankcard system and explaining it to other bank branches around the country and businessmen such as the likes of Gerry Harvey of Harvey Norman, Kerry then went to work for Bob and Jack Ingham – the Chicken Kings. He was looking after major accounts Kentucky Fried Chicken and Woolworths and entertaining their hierarchy at functions and social events in the process;







He was also in control of the distribution of Penfolds most famous wine, Grange Hermitage.

One hell of a hot potato as demand always exceeded supply.

He regularly took clients to be entertained at their wineries in the Hunter Valley, South Australia and Victoria and most other major sporting events, due to his sponsorship duties.

Under Penfolds brand, Southcorp Wines were the major sponsor for many years of St. George Rugby League side, whilst sponsoring ten out of the other fifteen sides in the competition under other brand names as well. They also had seven private boxes amongst these other rugby league grounds, run by his Managers and Sales Reps for entertaining clients.

Golf also was another form of entertaining clients, inviting them to play in Pro Ams so that they could be in the company of high-profile sports men and women athletes, well known identities and politicians.

The Entertainment Centre and Opera House was other areas used for entertaining clients and giving them the chance to meet major artists, backstage after their shows.

All of which came under Kerry's administration.


He also represented Lakeside Golf Club, then Studley Park Golf Club in the Men's and Mixed Pennant.

In later years, Kerry also became a Board Member of Penrith Panthers for over ten years, as Chairman of their Marketing and Remuneration committees.

This resulted in exchanging ideas with such other Boards as Manchester United Soccer, Lords Cricket Club, Leeds Rugby League and Collingwood AFL, as well as attending World Cup Challenge matches in England along with State of Origin Matches and Tests in Australia.

As Panthers were major customers of Toohey's Brewery and Ainsworth and IGT poker machine manufactures, Kerry was also regularly invited to events such as Melbourne Cup, Golden Slipper and other major events. Whilst all of this may sound glamourous, between his regular job and Panthers, he averaged 4-5 nights out a week as well as attending 3-4 luncheons a week, 1 Rugby league game a week amongst other sports as well and often much more than this, whilst this was very tiring, he would not have swapped it for anything, due to the many world famous sporting personalities and entertainers that he was fortunate enough to meet during this time.

Having moved to Grasmere in 2015 Helen and Kerry took up lawn bowls. They joined Camden Club in 2015 and 2016 respectively and with the coaching of Alex Matheson



Kerry declared that the beauty of our great club is its camaraderie and the sportsmanship shown by the members. He had two great nail-biting singles matches in his early years that went down to the wire against Bob Wareham and Danny Beebar. It didn't matter who won or lost because of the great spirit and sportsmanship those matches were played in, which is still the way it is today.

Kerry said "We are lucky at Camden to have so many top players that we get to share the green with and learn from".

Two special people who he loved playing pennants with over the years are Sharlene Wilson, Camden's first lady member to be selected in the Open Pennant Division and his best mate our President Gary Hudson.

Kerry and Helen look forward to further great times ahead -GO CAMDEN.

PURPOSEFUL PRACTICE IS KEY

What is purposeful practice? Regular 'rolling up' or practice may involve mindless repetitions, whereas deliberate practice focuses attention towards a specific goal of improving performance. Purposeful practice also involves an element of systematic approach. Regular practice still has its benefits and helps to reinforce and maintain basic technique during the early stages of improvement. However, if you ultimately want to overcome plateaus in performance, be more competitive and nail that backhand drive consistently than planned purposeful practice is the only way.

The key to success with purposeful practice is feedback! Receiving immediate feedback while performing skills/drills on the green will enable you to adopt and further understand your actual 'strengths' and 'weaknesses', rather than predicting what your perceived abilities may be.

The best method of introducing an immediate feedback system while performing specific skills/drills is through a scoring system. Taking this approach on scoring the outcome of each bowl you deliver in relation to the skills/drills goal, will allow you to not only compare results on the day of practice but also over time. Patterns in strengths or weaknesses can be highlighted in such things as; jack length, green conditions, matt position, weather, rinks played on, forehand and backhand shots.



A basic example of a scoring system which is widely used within the bowls community, would be the use of the matt length to determine a score. E.g., If the bowl delivered falls within a matt length of its target, then a point is scored. If the bowl unfortunately finishes more than a matt length from the target, then the score is zero. Alternatively, you can go further with this approach and also use the matt width to increase scoring opportunities. You can be creative and implement your own scoring system and approaches, however sometimes the



basic approach with just the matt and a piece of paper/phone to note down scores, can be the most effective.

New approaches to practice can incite growth, development and overcome lulls in performance.

How to start

Step 1 – Select one of the fundamental skills you can improve upon; Draw shot, Up shot, Drive shot, Cover Shot

Step 2 – Adopt scoring system, E.g., 1 point for each bowl that falls within a matt length of the target or 3 points for each bowl that falls within a matt width of the target

Step 3 – Note each bowls score after each end and document whether it was a forehand or backhand shot

Step 4 – Make session notes on such things as; rink played on, green speed, date, weather conditions etc.

Step 5 – Collate scores over a timeframe you have specified (more data will give a fair reflection of your average performance) and highlight 'strengths' or 'weaknesses' by using where you have scored the most or least

Step 6 – Adjust and plan purposeful practice sessions to focus on highlighted weaknesses and/or technique performing that skill

KILROY WAS HERE!

WHO WAS KILROY?

He is engraved in stone in the National War Memorial in Washington, DC- back in a small alcove where very few people have seen it. For the WWII generation, this will bring back memories. For you younger folks, it's a bit of trivia that is a part of our American history. Anyone born in 1913 to about 1950, is familiar with Kilroy. No one knew why he was so well known-but everybody seemed to get into it. So, who was Kilroy?

In 1946 the American Transit Association, through its radio program, "Speak to America," sponsored a nationwide contest to find the real Kilroy, offering a prize of a real trolley car to the person who could prove himself to be the genuine article. Almost 40 men stepped forward to make that claim, but only James Kilroy from Halifax, Massachusetts, had evidence of his identity.

'Kilroy' was a 46-year-old shipyard worker during the war who worked as a checker at the Fore River Shipyard in Quincy. His job was to go around & check on the number of rivets completed. Riveters were on piecework & got paid by the rivet. He would count a block of rivets & put a check mark in semi-waxed lumber chalk, so the rivets wouldn't be counted twice. When Kilroy went off duty, the riveters would erase the mark. Later on, an off-shift inspector would come through & count the rivets a second time, resulting in double pay for the riveters.

One day Kilroy's boss called him into his office. The foreman was upset about all the wages being paid to riveters, & asked him to investigate. It was then he realized what had been going on. The tight spaces he had to crawl in to check the rivets didn't lend themselves to lugging around a paint can & brush, so Kilroy decided to stick with the waxy chalk. He continued to put his check mark on each job he inspected, but added 'KILROY WAS HERE' in king-sized letters next to the check,& eventually added the sketch of the chap with the long nose peering over the fence & that became part of the Kilroy message.

Once he did that, the riveters stopped trying to wipe away his marks. Ordinarily the rivets & chalk marks would have been covered up with paint. With the war on, however, ships were leaving the Quincy Yard so fast that there wasn't time to paint them. As a result, Kilroy's inspection "trademark" was seen by thousands of servicemen who boarded the troopships the yard produced.

His message apparently rang a bell with the servicemen, because they picked it up & spread it all over Europe & the South Pacific.

Before war's end, "Kilroy" had been here, there, and everywhere on the long hauls to Berlin & Tokyo. To the troops outbound in those ships, however, he was a complete mystery; all they knew for sure was that someone named Kilroy had "been there first."


As a joke, U.S. servicemen began placing the graffiti wherever they landed, claiming it was already there when they arrived.

Kilroy became the U.S. super-GI who had always "already been" wherever GIs went. It became a challenge to place the logo in the most unlikely places imaginable (it is said to be atop Mt. Everest, the Statue of Liberty, the underside of the Arc de Triomphe, & even scrawled in the dust on the moon.

As the war went on, the legend grew. Underwater demolition teams routinely sneaked ashore on Japanese-held islands in the Pacific to map the terrain for coming invasions by U.S. troops (& thus, presumably, were the first GI's there). On one occasion, however, they reported seeing enemy troops painting over the Kilroy logo!

In 1945, an outhouse was built for the exclusive use of Roosevelt, Stalin, & Churchill at the Potsdam conference. Its first occupant was Stalin, who emerged & asked his aide (in Russian), "Who is Kilroy?"

To help prove his authenticity in 1946, James Kilroy brought along officials from the shipyard & some of the riveters. He won the trolley car, which he gave to his nine children as a Christmas gift & set it up as a playhouse in the Kilroy yard in Halifax, Massachusetts. And The Tradition Continues...

WHEN YOU CAN'T MAKE UP YOUR MIND IF YOU WANT TO GO RIDING, BOATING OR CAMPING



Golden Fleece, Australia's first oil company and biggest restaurant chain.

Before the big American takeaways arrived, Golden Fleece was the largest restaurant chain in Australia.

There are probably a few things that come to mind when reminiscing about long road trips across Australia between the 1950s and '70s.

Things like overheating cars, AM radio and the unmistakable icon of the Golden Fleece.

Before the days of the giant fast-food outlets, Golden Fleece restaurants were a much-looked for sign on the horizon when driving long distances.

At its peak, Golden Fleece had hundreds of roadhouses and restaurants and thousands of distributors of its fuel and chemical products.

Then in 1981 Golden Fleece all but disappeared from the landscape, almost overnight.



A Golden Fleece service station was easy to spot with its unique blue and yellow branding.

In the beginning

In 1913 Harold Crofton (HC) Sleigh was a shipping agent who got stuck with several tins of "motor spirit" from California that the consignee couldn't pay for.

After selling the tins to recoup his costs, Sleigh saw how profitable the sale was due to the rising popularity of cars.

The name Golden Fleece was registered, and Australia's first oil company was born.

Author and Australian petroleum historian Colin J. Dennett said Golden Fleece was more of an accident rather than a strategic business decision.

"Although HC Sleigh got into petrol re-selling, he was always more interested in shipping," he said.

"At the time all his competition was large, overseas-owned oil companies so Golden Fleece became the first Australian oil company."

The Golden Ram


Exactly why HC Sleigh chose the golden ram as his logo has been lost to history.

Some historians have said it's linked to the Distinguished Order of the Golden Fleece, others claim that it was inspired by a golden fleece story in Greek mythology.

The golden ram image on top of hundreds of fuel pumps across Australia had a very unlikely name ... David.







It was named after David of Dalkieth, who won the strong wool ram hogget prize at the 1926 Sydney Show. The ram was eventually sold for 500 guineas, which was record at the time.

"HC Sleigh developed the concept of the ram, which had a very Australiana type of appeal," Mr Dennett said.

"Australia was known for riding on the sheep's back thanks to the popularity of wool."

Going it alone

In the 1920s and '30s, petrol stations sold a variety of fuel brands. A motorist could pull up and pick from Golden Fleece, Shell or many other brands to refuel their car.

"Before the 1950s all fuel was sold through multi-brand outlets," Mr Dennett said.



Fuel wholesalers once competed for space at independent multi-brand outlets.

"Golden Fleece, Shell and Ampol and all the other brands had to compete for space.

"The problem was that the overseas multinationals like Shell could set the price and the others had to follow.

"Golden Fleece was one of the first to open their very own one-brand site, which the other fuel companies soon followed, becoming the norm that we see now."

Before American takeaway


At its height, HC Sleigh Limited operated the largest restaurant chain in the country, with about 5,000 service stations, roadhouses and distributors across Australia.

"They were revolutionary in the way that they distinguished their service stations from everything else," Mr Dennett said.

"Ampol had roadhouses but that was mainly for truck drivers.

"Golden Fleece wanted family restaurants where people could stop and sit and even get a three-course meal.

"They were the place to go before the American takeaways came along."

Bill Whittaker, who worked at Golden fleece in Caboolture, Rockhampton and Winton from 1973 until 1981, said that in some areas, Golden Fleece was the only restaurant in town.

"They were homemade meals and I know that in smaller towns, people would go to their local Golden Fleece restaurant for dinner," he said.

"They had restaurant managers and trained chefs and food supervisors travelling around the state checking on the quality and size portions of the food."

Fuel crisis

Golden Fleece started to struggle during the fuel and energy crisis of the 1970s and as it didn't own its own refinery, it was Caltex's biggest customer.

In 1981 Peter Sleigh (HC Sleigh's grandson) accepted an offer from Caltex to buy the company outright.

Almost immediately Golden Fleece stations were changed over to Caltex and over time the restaurants were either closed or converted to takeaway food.



Golden Fleece service stations like this one in Cairns were found across Australia.

"When Caltex first bought Golden Fleece, they said they were going to run two brands, but that didn't last long and less than a year later they were phasing out the Golden Fleece brand," Mr Whittaker said.

"Golden Fleece had a special place in people's hearts and when Caltex started to disband the restaurants which people loved, there was pushback from the public."

Valuable memorabilia

These days Golden Fleece memorabilia is fetching big prices on the internet and at country auctions.





Golden Fleece collectables are now getting big prices from collectors due to their unique look and logo.

Mr Dennett said he had spoken to representatives from Ampol (now owners of the Golden Fleece brand after merging with Caltex) about the possibility of the Golden Fleece brand making a comeback.

"I spoke with the CEO about why Golden Fleece can't make a comeback, and he didn't really answer me," he said.

"Of all the companies out there for collectors and enthusiasts, no company generates more interest and enthusiasm as does Golden Fleece."

A spokesperson for Ampol said, "Golden Fleece holds iconic status as a brand and forms an important part of Ampol's storied history.

"Ampol always has ongoing conversations about its brands and their role in its wider portfolio"




