Just think how excited people would be for such technology, it would sell like hot cakes!










# **AROUND THE GREENS**

### **MEMBER PROFILE – BRIAN COOKE**



Brian Cooke's recent win at 89 years old in the Camden Bowling Clubs Veteran Pairs with Karl Szynal, was only the latest championship win in his long sporting career. Playing tennis as a young man he collected a few victories locally but his first foray into serious competition was in ballroom dancing.

As a member of the Star Ballroom Studio in Bentleigh, which is now Melbourne's oldest dance studio, he found something he loved and was successful at, winning two Victorian Championships and one World Championship when that competition came to Australia. However, due to the isolation the opposition then was not what it would be today.

Brian was born and raised in the Northern Beaches suburb of Belrose in a basic dwelling with dirt floors and whitewashed walls. He spent his days as one of the local kids playing in the bush and nearby creeks. He taught himself tennis at a nearby public court and had many games with his father who was able to spin the ball viciously. Tennis was his sport of choice for most of his life until introduced to lawn bowls. In his days on the North Shore courts, he was soundly defeated by none other than John Newcombe.

His partner at the time was on stage with the famous Margaret Rutherford and her husband Stringer Davis. When the stage play moved to Melbourne Brian relocated there and fell in love with the city. Melbourne was his town.

After his move to Melbourne and the breakdown of his relationship with the actor, he worked in retail while still playing tennis and ballroom dancing. It was a wonderful time in his life as he was fully engaged in activities that he loved and in a new relationship with the owner of a popular local giftware business.

Gay relationships in those days were illegal which led to greater stresses then normal couples would endure. The Melbourne gay society was alive and vibrant with parties at private houses and an annual ball to raise money for guide dogs.

To maintain harmony in his personal relationship Brian gave away ballroom dancing but maintained his interest in tennis. He was the Records Keeper for the Eastern Suburbs Tennis Association for over twenty years. In this job he kept the weekly playing records for over 4000 local competitors.

When his partner of 40 years developed lung cancer, they decided to move to the drier climate of the Gold Coast. Here he played Veterans Tennis and was again privileged to be





beaten by a future champion in Pat Cash when he was still a junior. Brian played on centre court at Milton which is now the Roy Emerson Tennis centre against noted Davis Cup player Mal Anderson. He never won a point in the first set and received a lonely applause from a single spectator for a successful overhead smash in the second. Mal took him to the bar afterwards and proved to be a true gentleman.

When the breakdown of his 40-year relationship left him with nothing, Brian was rescued by his sister Marg and went to live with her in Rathmines. Here she introduced him to lawn bowls.

In his twenty years with the Rathmines Memorial Bowling Club Brian won 25 Championships but laments that the Major Pairs and Major Singles were not among them. His biggest regret in lawn bowls is that he never won the Singles being runner up five times. He was awarded Bowler of the Year on two occasions. While at Rathmines he became a coach and umpire and was the Bowls Organizer. He worked behind the bar and toted up the money from the poker machines.

Even in these days he had to endure prejudice when a letter arrived at the club questioning if a gay man can be trusted with the money and if it was safe for him to be pouring beer. The directors backed him fully and had total confidence in their employee.

He gained a lot of satisfaction from helping new players and was delighted when one of his pupils won the Ladies Singles championship and another played in the Grade 1 pennant team. Brian was one of the first to coach disabled players and was always looking to get a new player a game.

Coming to Camden late in life to help his sister Marg look after her husband Kevin Crossingham he joined the Camden Men's Bowling Club where Kerry Lowe talked him into taking on the work of Bowls Co-ordinator. He found the competition at Camden much stronger than at Rathmines so was pleased to be runner up in the Major Pairs in his first year with the club.

During a lifetime of service to sporting clubs Brian has been awarded life membership to the Eastern Districts Tennis Association in Melbourne, the Toronto Workers Club for his tennis organisation and the Rathmines Memorial Bowling Club for his twenty years' service there.

His greatest rewards have come from winning championships and coaching new players and seeing them succeed. His motto has always been "what you get out of the game – put it back."

# Fast Track Your Game Development With Purposeful Practice

Time spent on the bowling green can mean many different things to different bowlers. From catching up with mates while 'chucking' down a few bowls, to specific drills performed to fine tune a certain technique and everything in between. Obviously not everyone wants to become the next Alex Marshall, but for those of us who want to make the most of what precious time we get on the green, purposeful practice is the tool to take your game to the next level.

# **PURPOSEFUL PRACTICE IS KEY**

What is purposeful practice? Regular 'rolling up' or practice may involve mindless repetitions, whereas deliberate practice focuses attention towards a specific goal of improving performance. Purposeful practice also involves an element of systematic approach. Regular practice still has its benefits and helps to reinforce and maintain basic technique during the early stages of improvement. However, if you ultimately want to overcome plateaus in performance, be more competitive and nail that backhand drive consistently than planned purposeful practice is the only way.

The key to success with purposeful practice is feedback! Receiving immediate feedback while performing skills/drills on the green will enable you to adopt and further understand your actual 'strengths' and 'weaknesses', rather than predicting what your perceived abilities may be.







The best method of introducing an immediate feedback system while performing specific skills/drills is through a scoring system. Taking this approach on scoring the outcome of each bowl you deliver in relation to the skills/drills goal, will allow you to not only compare results on the day of practice but also over time. Patterns in strengths or weaknesses can be highlighted in such things as; jack length, green conditions, matt position, weather, rinks played on, forehand and backhand shots.



A basic example of a scoring system which is widely used within the bowls community, would be the use of the matt length to determine a score. E.g., If the bowl delivered falls within a matt length of its target, then a point is scored. If the bowl unfortunately finishes more than a matt length from the target, then the score is zero. Alternatively, you can go further with this approach and also use the matt width to increase scoring opportunities. You can be creative and implement your own scoring system and approaches, however sometimes the basic approach with just the matt and a piece of paper/phone to note down scores, can be the most effective.

New approaches to practice can incite growth, development and overcome lulls in performance.

How to start





Step 1 – Select one of the fundamental skills you can improve upon; Draw shot, Up shot, Drive shot, Cover Shot

Step 2 – Adopt scoring system, E.g., 1 point for each bowl that falls within a matt length of the target or 3 points for each bowl that falls within a matt width of the target

Step 3 – Note each bowls score after each end and document whether it was a forehand or backhand shot

Step 4 – Make session notes on such things as; rink played on, green speed, date, weather conditions etc.

Step 5 – Collate scores over a timeframe you have specified (more data will give a fair reflection of your average performance) and highlight 'strengths' or 'weaknesses' by using where you have scored the most or least

Step 6 – Adjust and plan purposeful practice sessions to focus on highlighted weaknesses and/or technique performing that skill






# 1935 Hoffman X-8 Prototype
