


























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THE CHANGING OF THE GUARD

MEMBER PROFILE - KEITH PHEGAN





Keith Phegan is a lot more than the little man who takes your money on a Thursday with a glass of red at his elbow. He has lived all over Australia and been involved in many different sports.

Born in the City of Sydney Keith spent his first few years in Arncliffe and Neutral Bay before the family moved to Riverwood where he started school and then he went on to East Hills Boys High where he played all the usual sports in rugby, cricket, tennis and basketball. Graduating with his Leaving Certificate he began five years at university studying for his Bachelor's Degree in Commerce majoring in Accountancy. Then he did a post graduate diploma in Cost Accounting. What little free time he had was taken up with motorbikes and tennis. Being a part time course Keith worked at various companies like Shell, Nestle and Taubman's as a clerical assistant as part of his course training. He rode his motorbike to and from work and claimed it was the only way to travel.

In fact, he raced bikes in short circuit scrambles and was very competitive but only at club level.

After marrying Maureen, he went to work for her uncle who compiled the greyhound racing recorder. Dissatisfied with the lack of potential Keith took up a job with James Hardie of asbestos fame. Conditions were not conducive to good health, but the staff were a happy bunch, and many good times were enjoyed by all. And all his friends lived on! About a thousand people worked there until it was closed in the mid 80's and all thought it was a good place to work.

Keith was encouraged to give up motorbikes as he had few near misses. One day he returned home to Pennant Hills with Maureen meeting him at the door with his helmet in one hand and his jacket in the other demanding an explanation for the damage on them. The previous day he had gone for a spill when he hit an oil slick going downhill on a bend. That was the end of the motorbikes.

Ensuing years saw Keith active in his lifelong passion of sailing. He sailed a 12-foot Gwen at the St George Sailing Club at Taren Point. Although once again competitive at just club level he enjoyed the fellowship and camaraderie the most. He contributed to the Milane Sailing club by laying the course, manning the start line and piloting the safety boat looking for upturned sailors.

Pennant Hills saw his first foray into lawn bowls when a neighbour introduced him to the sport but at this time in his life kids' sport took most of his time.







With a company car a big enticement for the move. Keith and Maureen accepted a transfer to Adelaide where Keith took on the duties of Chief Bean Counter with Iplex Plastics, a subsidiary of James Hardie.

He continued with sport in his spare time with squash and sailing being his choice. In Adelaide he sailed a 12-foot catamaran which proved a very fast craft. He was extremely competitive in the catamaran class taking a National Title in a competition in Victoria. He then switched to a 16-footer so his daughter could sail with him but eventually she found someone younger and better looking to sail with so he returned to the 14-foot class.

After eighteen years with James Hardie Keith decided it was time for a change so bought into a Graphic Arts company. This was a new horizon and very interesting work totally outside of anything he had done previously. His business partner also sailed and played golf, so they got on really well.

Retiring from the Graphic Arts company after fourteen years, Keith and Maureen moved across the continent to Mandurah near Perth to be closer to family. There they had a nice house on the estuary enjoying the seaside lifestyle with crabbing, fishing and crayfishing. Here Keith played golf at the undulating Halls Head Golf Club and continued his interest in squash.

Realising that readily available babysitting was holding his son back from advancement with his company Alcoa who required him to go overseas, Keith and Maureen moved again. This time to Airlie Beach in Queensland.

Here the fish were big, but the crocodiles were bigger and there were too many bities in the water to go sailing. This is where Keith worked on his basic bowls game at the Airlie Beach Bowls club with about 30 members.

With the demise of Ansett there was only one flight a week out of Airlie Beach so once again Keith and Maureen moved so they had easier access to family. This time to the Gold Coast where they joined the Helensvale Bowling club. Keith was once again involved in administration organising the Tuesday Social Mixed and Friday Men's Pairs.

Here he met two most notable bowlers. Brett Wilkie and Nathan Rice were both World Champions and National Champions yet were not above playing in a carnival with Grade 7 players and having a beer afterwards. At one competition at Tweed Heads, Brett suggested they change positions with each game rather than having a national champion skipper every game.

One day Keith was playing against Nathan and having an exceptional game at lead dropping the bowl on the jack every time when the great man, after several ends said, 'Keith, stop getting them so close to the jack as I only have to keep knocking them off.' Which is exactly what he was doing.

A highlight of his retirement has been to follow the State Sides Series where each state selects a team to compete against each other. Just like a national pennant competition. The couple hook up the caravan and travel all over the country to the host city. They have visited every capital city except Darwin, taking great pleasure in watching the top players perform.

Keith Phegan has lived in four states and fourteen different houses, been married for 59 years to a wonderful woman and met some amazing people in his long life. Sailing has been his greatest love as far as sport is concerned and he has always been committed to giving something









back to the club. This is exactly what he is doing in Camden. Playing, contributing and enjoying a red wine with it.



TINA TURNER

Very inspirational...

Ike may have opened doors for her ...

But it was Tina herself who blew the doors off their hinges!

In the divorce she made it clear she did not want any money, any property and....she only wanted to keep her stage name.

In 1984, at the age of 45, she released the hugely successful album "Private Dancer". In a sea of much younger female artists and super groups she achieved chart success and one of the songs, "What's Love Got to Do with It" was a chart phenomenon.

She said "he can keep the belongings ...

Because I now have my future!"







When Tina Turner left her first husband - who was also her boss, captor, and brutal tormentor - she snuck out of their Dallas hotel room with a single thought in her mind: "The way out is through the door." From there she fled across the midnight freeway, semi-trucks careening past her, with 36 cents and a Mobil gas card in her pocket. As soon as she decided to walk out that door, she owned nothing else.

When she filed for divorce, she made an unusual request. She didn't want anything: not the song rights, not the cars, not the houses, not the money. All she wanted was the stage name he gave her - Tina - and her married name - Turner. This was the name by which the world had come to know her, and keeping it was her only chance to salvage her career. Things could have gone a lot of ways from there. She could have laboured in obscurity for decades, maybe making records on small labels to be prized by vinyl connoisseurs in Portland. She could have stayed in Vegas, where she first went to get her chops back up, and worked as a nostalgia act. And, of course, given what she had been through, she might have ... not made it.

What happened instead is that Tina Turner became the biggest global rock star of the 80s. I'm old enough to barely remember this, but if you aren't, it was like this: The Rolling Stones would headline a stadium one day, and the next day it would be Tina Turner. A middle-aged Black woman - she became a rock star at 42! - sitting atop the 1980s like it was her throne. She managed this because of whatever rare stuff she was made of (this is a woman whose label gave her two weeks to record her solo debut, Private Dancer, which went five times platinum); because she decided to speak publicly about her abusive marriage and forge her own identity, and in doing so give hope and courage to countless women; and also because - in a perhaps unlikely twist for a girl from Nutbush, Tennessee - she had her practice of Soka Gakkai Nichiren Buddhism, to which she credited her survival. She remained devout until the end.









Tina's second marriage - to her, her only marriage - was to Edwin Bach, a Swiss music executive 16 years her junior. Of him, she said, "Erwin, who is a force of nature in his own right, has never been the least bit intimidated by my career, my talents, or my fame." In 2016, after a barrage of health problems, Tina's kidneys began to fail. A Swiss citizen by then, she had started preparing for assisted suicide when her husband stepped in. According to Tina, he said, "He didn't want another woman, or another life."

He gave her one of his kidneys, buying her the remainder of her time on this earth and perhaps closing a cycle which took her from a man who inflicted injury upon her to a man willing to inflict injury upon himself to save her from harm.

Born into a share-cropping family as Anna Mae Bullock in 1939, she died Tina Turner in a palatial Swiss estate: the queen of rock 'n roll; a storm of a performer with a wildcat-fierce voice; a dancer of visceral, spine-tingling potency and ability; a beauty for the ages; a survivor of terrible abuse and an advocate for others in similar situations; an author and actress; a devout Buddhist; a wife and mother; a human being of rare talent and perseverance who, through her transcendent brilliance, became a legend.







